General Class Information

Homework

Our homework changes focus this term in the lead up to the SATs tests. I am not setting new spellings or times tables each week. The children are encouraged to become responsible for their own revision at home. Please support them with this.

These are my suggestions for revision over the next few weeks:

*Spelling Revision

Every morning in class, the children are recapping some of the statutory spelling words. They will bring home a copy of these each day. Please can they continue to practise these at home. For those who find spelling tricky, I have suggested choosing two or three of these words and work on these.

*Revisit test papers – SpaG & Maths

The children have been bringing home test papers that they have completed in school. It would be useful for them to revisit questions on the SPaG and Maths papers in particular and have another go at these.

*Make use of website subscriptions - Maths.co.uk / SPaG.com / Sumdog / TTRS

Maths.co.uk is a new one which I can set revision activities linked to different areas of the maths curriculum.

SPaG.com – I will continue to set activities on here each week.

Sumdog - I am using this to set revision activities for spelling, SPaG and Maths.

TTRS - keep practising times tables recall.

The Year 6 SATs tests are fast approaching. They are in Week 4 of this half term.

Topic Learning – Britain at War

This project teaches children about the causes, events and consequences of the First and Second World Wars, the influence of new inventions on warfare, how life in Great Britain was affected and the legacy of the wars in the post-war period.

There is a Knowledge Organiser, detailing the information the children will be expected to learn during this unit of work. This is posted on our class webpage. Please read through this with your child at home and discuss the information provided.



Our class novel for this term is Goodnight Mister Tom, which is linked to our second world war section of our topic.

A shy and quiet World War II evacuee is housed by a disgruntled old man, and they soon develop a close bond.

Mrs Higgs will be teaching R.E. on Thursdays. In RE this half term we are continuing with our Understanding Christianity units and will be acting as detectives to determine why Christians think Jesus was resurrected. Our key question is 'What difference does the resurrection make to Christians?' The children will look for evidence in the Gospel of Luke. They will be asked to offer and justify their own responses to what difference belief in Resurrection might make to how people respond to challenges and problems in the world today.

Music



Mrs Higgs will be teaching music on Thursdays. Our Music topic this half term focuses on 'Introducing Chords' and has a social theme of how music teaches us about our community. In this topic, the children will continue furthering their knowledge about key and time signatures. This half term they will be introduced to the Key Signatures of D minor and E major.

Handball

Pupils will develop key skills of attacking and defending such as throwing, catching, dribbling, intercepting and shooting. Pupils use these skills to maintain possession of the ball and to create scoring opportunities in attack. They will develop defending principles such as gaining possession of the ball, denying space and stopping goals. They will be encouraged to work collaboratively to develop strategies and tactics in both attack and defence. They develop their understanding of the rules and the importance of fair play and honesty whilst self-managing matches. They will improve their ability to evaluate their own and others' performance.

Tennis

In this unit pupils develop their competencies in racket skills when playing Tennis. They learn specific skills such as a forehand, backhand, volley and underarm serve. Pupils are given opportunities to work cooperatively with others and show honesty and fair play when abiding by the rules. Pupils develop their tactical awareness, learning how to outwit an opponent.

Languages - French

In Desert Class, French is taught by specialist French teachers from Shaftesbury School, Mr Gardiner and Miss Edwards. They will continue to come into school on Wednesday afternoons to deliver these lessons.

This coming half term, Desert class will be focussing on the theme of holidays.

They will start with exploring metropolitan France, talking about common attractions and historical sites before learning how to express things that they would like to see and do. We will also talk about interpreting maps, theme parks and understanding/giving directions in French. Following this, we will expand our horizons worldwide, talking about previous holidays and experiences using the past tense (with is something that is usually introduced in Year 8!). The term will end with a reading assessment where students will reflect on their learning and think about their next steps with the French language.

PSHE Education (Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education) - Jigsaw



Our next unit is **Relationships**. In this Puzzle the class look at mental health and how to take care of their own mental well-being. They talk about the grief cycle and its various stages; they also discuss the different causes of grief and loss. The children talk about people who

can try to control them or have power over them. They look at online safety, learning how to judge if something is safe and helpful as well as talking about communicating with friends and family in a positive and safe way.
