# Engaging

Watch the Powerpoint video about a story Jesus once told about a sower and seeds. The story is a parable, which means that it contains an important message.

Watch carefully and then chat to your talk partner about what you think the message behind the story might be.

Sometimes the story is called the parable of the Four Soils because even though the sower spreads the seed over all of the ground, only one part of the soil is deep, rich and fertile. The seed that falls into this soil puts down good roots and grows into a healthy, fruitful plant. However, if the seed falls into the parts of the ground where the soil is shallow or rocky or full of weeds, it will not grow properly.

Why do you think this is?

The seed in the story represents God's wise teaching which will help us flourish and live our lives well.

The 4 soils in the sorry represent the different types of people who hear his teaching.

Some people will be like the deep, rich, fertile soil. They will hear God's wise teaching and try to put it into practice in their lives. They will do their best to love others and make a difference in the world. Their lives will be fruitful.

Some people will be like the other types of shallow, rocky or weedy soils. They will hear God's teaching but it doesn't reach their hearts and they will not put it into practice. They will soon forget all about it.
