Gathering

Music on entry. Children enter quietly

Engaging

1. Ask the children if they could help with the task.

Box of balls on one side of room and empty box on the other side. Ask for a volunteer to move all the balls, one at a time to the other box. How long does it take? Was it easy?

As for 6 children to help and support each other and decide how they can move the balls from one box to the other. Was this easier? Why?

2. Sometimes there are people who need help and support to make life easier for them. Look at our school vision tree. We say that 'Supporting families' is very important to us. How does our school support each other? Why is it so important?

- 3. There is a quotation from Proverbs 11.17 which says: 'Being kind to others helps us too.'
- 4. Point out that there are people who dedicate their lives to helping others: people who save lives (doctors, nurses, paramedics, ambulance drivers, etc.); people who face danger to help others (soldiers, sailors, RAF members, firefighters, police officers, etc.). Some people work throughout the night when the rest of us are sleeping (electricity supply workers, carers, lorry drivers, etc.). Most do get paid for what they do but they still choose a sometimes difficult way of life because they want to help others.
- Jesus tells us to be kind to others. Jesus was kind to everyone, even people
 who hated him. When you show support and kindness to others you are being
 more like Jesus. Loving, supporting and helping everyone makes a Christian
 special.
- 6. Ask the children to think of ways that they can support one another and to encourage a caring and helpful attitude towards others.

Follow-up Class worship

Read the Aesop Fable:

The Lion and the Mouse
