# Gathering

## Engaging

- 1. In today's worship we are going to learn that God asks us to love everyone.
- 2. Matthew 22:39 Introduce to the children that the second commandment is 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'
- 3. God wants us to love our neighbours like we love our self. What do you think God means by that?"

"You want to keep yourself happy, right? And you take care of what you need. When you are thirsty you drink water and when you are hungry you eat food. We show love to others by helping them be happy and by taking care of their needs."

4. Listen to this story from the Bible:

One day a man was talking to Jesus. He said "I know that I should love God with all my heart and that I should love my neighbour too. But who is my neighbour?"

Then Jesus told the man a story.

One day there was a man walking down the road, he was going on a trip. Suddenly some robbers jumped out from behind some rocks and hit him. They took all his things and left the man lying hurt by the side of the road.

A little while later someone came walking down the road. It was a man who worked in Gods temple. He could have helped the man who was hurt but instead when he saw the man he crossed over and walked on the other side of the street. And walked straight passed the man. Another man walked by and did the same thing. Eventually a man came past on his donkey. This man came from a different country. As he got close he saw the hurt man and he stopped. He put bandages on him and then he put him on the donkey and took him somewhere he could rest and get better.

Jesus had finished telling his story, so he looked at the man and asked: "Who was the hurt mans neighbour?" The man replied "The one who helped the hurt man". Jesus said "then your neighbour is anyone who needs your help"

5. Ask how the children would feel if it was them lying their hurt and no one stopped to help them?

Ask the children who the hurt mans neighbour was

Ask the Children if they can think of someone who needs their help that they could love this week?

6. Introduce the fact that our school really wants to 'Support families.' Why is this important?

How can we help all of our Shillingstone families at the moment?

### Responding

Is there someone who might need your help today? Maybe God will use your hands, your words or your kindness to help that person.

Perhaps there is something that you need help with today. You could ask God to help you today.

	Explain that, as you say the prayer, you are going to pause for a moment in two places to give the children the opportunity to think about others and to add their own needs.
